## Insight to RUSA journey-Its Impact

The financial assistance received from RUSA in the form of preparatory and infrastructure grant has empowered the college to achieve its objective of providing quality education to students and ensuring their holistic development. Since the implementation of RUSA scheme, college has experienced complete transformation and intra organisational development in quantitative and qualitative form.

Construction of Women hostel is one of the major projects undertaken by the college and considerable sum has been utilised on the construction of 17 rooms on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the hostel. In our college students also come from states like H.P, Haryana and far away places like Ladakh and Afghanistan. With the construction of additional rooms from the RUSA grant we will be able to accommodate more students who otherwise have to live in PGs. This would be beneficial to PG students and is indeed helpful to enhance gross enrolment ratio of the college.

Installation of renewable energy resources is one of the dream projects of our college which has been materialised only because of the RUSA Infrastructural grant. College has set up 40Kwp Solar Power Plant which provides electricity to the class rooms, Library, Computer Labs and student Centre. A state of the art, clean renewable energy system conveys the message that our institution is progressive and committed to good stewardship.

College has successfully utilised infrastructure grant on upgradation of hostel facilities, renovation of college hall, installation of RFID in college library, campus development and upgradation of laboratory resources. Upgradation of existing facilities ensures smooth teaching learning process not only for today but for many more years to come.

Under the procurement head, the college has purchased all in one computers, licensed softwares and multifunctional laser printers for further development of ICT. An amount of Rs. 34,38,814 has been spent on purchase of new computer systems, sports equipments, lab apparatus, books, e-resources and furniture for the benefit of the students and faculty members.

## Activities conducted under Capacity Building Programme

**Department of Psychology** organized a two-day workshop on 'Emotional Intelligence and EFT' on 16th & 17th February 2017. The workshop was conducted by a city based counselor and psychologist and the workshop was sponsored by RUSA. The workshop began with an informative talk on how to manage, regulate one's emotions. The workshop comprised of activity and game based orientation techniques. On 2nd day, students got to know EFT, Emotional freedom technique, which is a fascinating tool for personal improvement. The resource person gave a demonstration on how EFT is done involving tapping with finger tips on meridian points in the body and voicing positive affirmations.



A two day workshop on Psychometrics was Conducted on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2016. A team of city based counselors was resource persons. The workshop began with an informative talk on career counseling and the factors which should be considered while choosing the field of study and occupation. It was followed by an interactive session.

7-day Faculty Development Programme on the theme “The Latest Trends and Techniques in Higher Education” under the aegis of RUSA was held in college from 14th January to 20th January, 2017. The seven-day workshop was inaugurated by Prof. (Dr.) Dalip Kumar, Director, RUSA, and Chandigarh. Prof.(Dr.) S.C. Chaddha, Chairperson, University Business School, Punjab University, Chandigarh was the key note speaker on this occasion who discussed the significance of innovation and creativity in the teaching process and described the role of a teacher as a facilitator and motivator. Prof. (Dr.) Paramjit Kaur, the resource person for the next technical session, explained the loopholes in the evaluation process and curriculum. Day two of the workshop was conducted by Dr. Amit Lal from NIT Jalandhar, who familiarizes the participants with the use of statistical software, SPSS and gave them valuable insights in handling data for research work.



The emerging issues in the higher education system in India and its effects in structural formation of the society was discussed by Prof.(Dr.) Satish K Sharma, former Professor, Himachal Pradesh University in the first session of day 3 who stressed on the need for intense educational planning. The interdisciplinary role of Music and its scientific as well as aesthetic aspects was elaborated by Prof. (Dr.) Pankaj mala Sharma, Dept. of Music, PU, Chandigarh who amused the audience with her vast and diverse knowledge. Prof. Meenakshi Malhotra, UBS, Punjab University Chandigarh, stressed on conflict management procedures through communication model. Dr.Diljot Kaur sensitized the participants and analyzed her ideas for stress and time management through various procedures in the following session.



**Department of Science :** A one Day Workshop was held on **27.02.2019**, under the **Capacity Building Initiative of RUSA**. The objective of the workshop was to help students gain knowledge about the applications of basic sciences through live demonstrations, various science models and poster presentations. The workshop was conducted in two sessions. The workshop was conducted by Dr. M. S. Marwaha, President, IAPT. The workshop was attended by 80 students of the Science department (B.Sc. Non-Medical & B.Sc. I.T.) and 10 faculty members.


