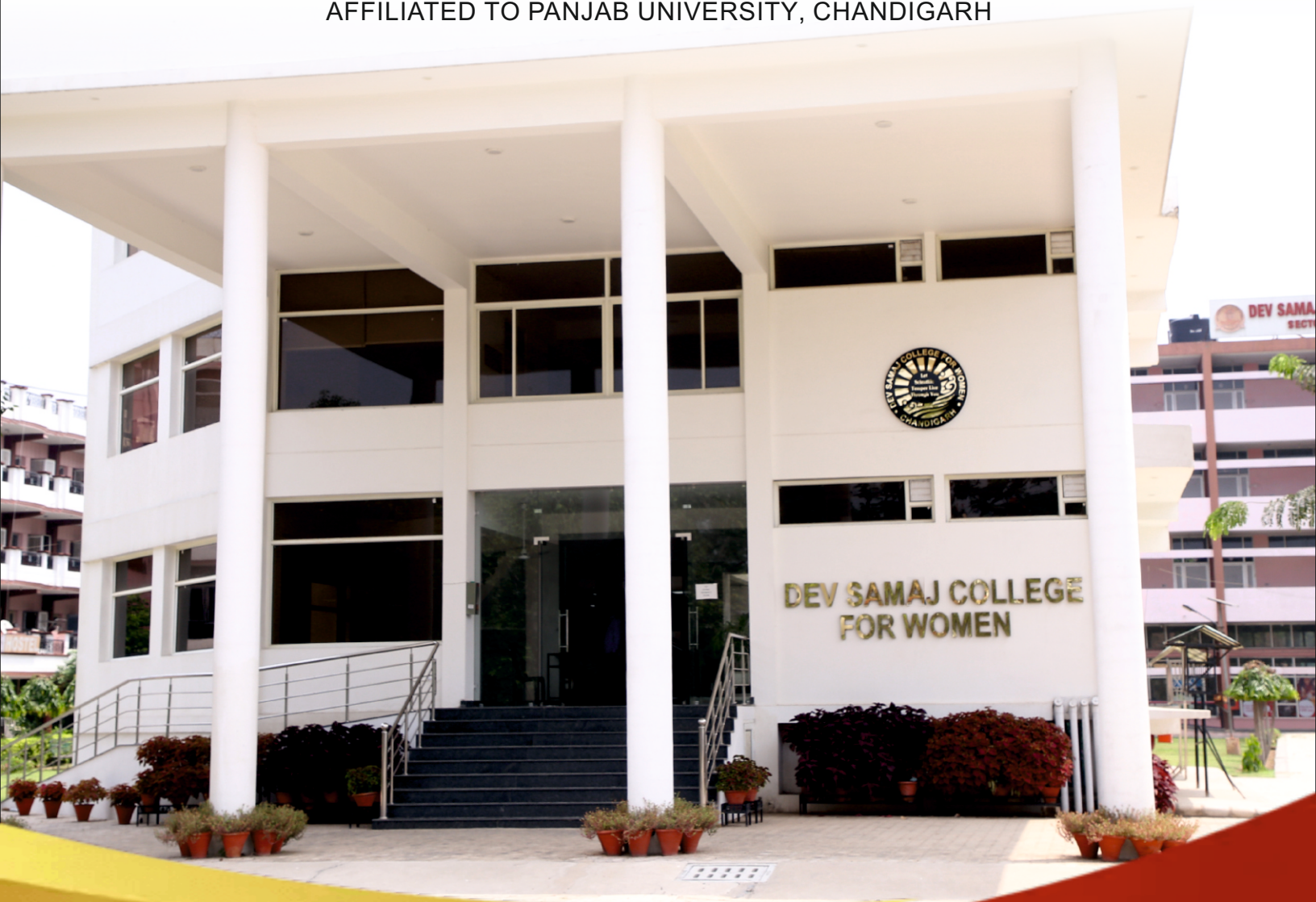

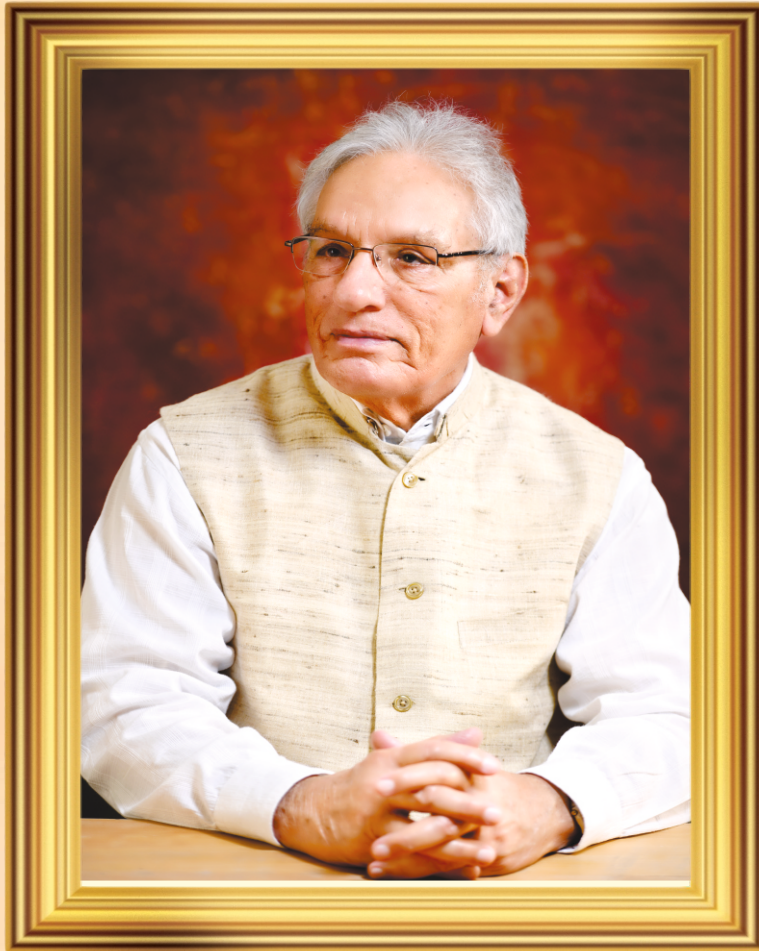

The library is also member of N-list programme of INFLIBNET and subscribing the e-resources of EBSCO database also. The library has a special reference section to meet the requirement of the students and teachers for academic and research work. The library is also member of NDLI CLUB of IIT Kharaghpur and National Digital Library of India. The database of library can be accessed by users through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) using the software. Presently, the library is using KOHA (23.05.04.000) software since May 2018. The database of the library collection can be accessed by the user through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) using the software. OPAC enables searching through clusters like Author, Subject, Title, Keyword, class, Publisher, Place of Publication and so on. It also uses Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology for efficient management of library services and convenience of users.

Fully Wifi enabled and equipped with latest ICT facilities. 8 computers with printers and scanners The library also features a Book Bank for economically weaker students.

Dear Club, a special club of the library provides an opportunity to young readers to participate in mind stimulating activities and inculcate in them a habit and love for reading. The most voracious reader is given a special prize at the Annual Prize distribution function.

## NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

– Become a part of the Largest Uniformed Voluntary Youth Organisation

The College proudly runs the National Cadet Corps (Army Wing) under 1 CHD Girls Battalion with an enrolled strength of 104 cadets, trained under the able guidance of Lt. Kesu Singh (recipient of Best ANO Award 2022). NCC provides students with discipline, leadership, adventure, and opportunities for a promising career in the Armed Forces and paramilitary services. Cadets are trained and groomed for regular commission in the armed and allied forces while developing confidence, teamwork, and patriotism.

### RULES

1. NCC is of three years' duration. Cadets must attend at least one camp to become eligible for the 'B' Certificate Examination and at least two camps to become eligible for the 'C' Certificate Examination.
2. NCC cadets must attend parades regularly and maintain a minimum 75% attendance record.

### INCENTIVES

#### Career Benefits

- ✦ Preference in recruitment to the Army, Navy, Air Force, and State Police Forces.
- ✦ Exemption from the written examination in certain entries of the Union Public Service Commission CDS Examination.
- ✦ 10–15 bonus marks in recruitment for paramilitary forces such as BSF, CISF, CRPF, and SSB.
- ✦ Waiver of written examination for the post of Soldier GD in eligible categories.



## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The college has two units of National Service Scheme (NSS) consisting of 200 volunteers. Students of all classes are eligible for enrolment in NSS. The volunteers are required to put in 120 hours of service during the academic session and attend NSS camps, for which certificates are awarded to them. The NSS Programme Officers have always taken keen interest in encouraging and sending students to various camps including Youth Exchange Programmes, National Integration Camps, and Adventure Camps organized by the University, State Government, and National Government from time to time, thereby providing students with opportunities for leadership development, cultural exchange, community service, and national integration. Objectives: To enrich the students' personality and deepen their understanding of the social environment in which they live; to develop socio-economic awareness and encourage students to spread the same among the local community of the adopted area; and to organize socio-economic activities designed to address social issues and community problems. Incentives: The college awards fee concessions and incentives to active NSS volunteers. Volunteers are also entitled to receive up to 3 percent additional marks in aggregate while seeking admission to higher classes after graduation.

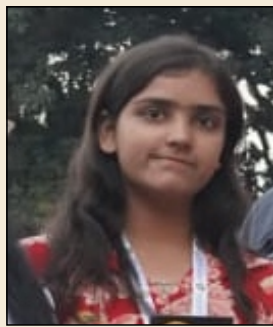

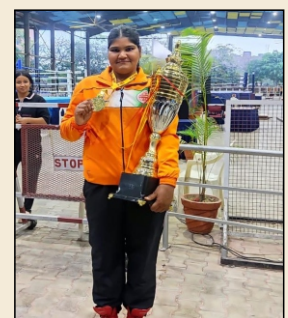

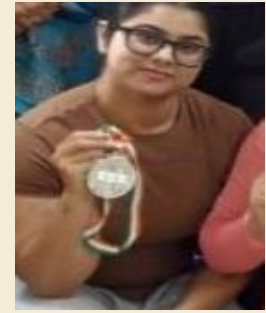

## HOW TO AVAIL SCHOLARSHIPS

### THE PROCEDURE

- The application for fee concession should be submitted on a prescribed form available with Scholarship In-charge at the time of admission and must be attached to the admission form. No such application shall be entertained later on.
- The applicants for fee concession shall be interviewed along with their parents by the Principal on the notified dates.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled tribes/Castes, other Backward Classes Minorities and Financially Disadvantaged can collect application forms of Government of India/State Government Scholarship from the Scholarship In-charge and submit them duly completed within one week from the date of admission.
- Fee concession, stipends and scholarships of all the categories are liable to be withdrawn if a student deteriorates in studies/remains irregular in attendance, or is found guilty of misbehaviour.
- Tuition fee concession will be granted to brilliant students, and those belonging to economically weaker section. Students intending to seek the concession are required to enclose all the required documents along with the admission form so that the cases can be decided right at the time of admission. They are required to submit an affidavit along with the admission form and if any document is found to be false or any information found to be concealed, their admission will be cancelled.
- On shifting from one course to another, a student if granted tuition fee concession on the basis mentioned above in the former course will not be entitled to claim the said concession in the latter course as a matter of right i.e. in the latter course it would depend upon the availability of the concession.

### INCENTIVES

- 25 most needy and meritorious students will be offered concessional education throughout the year as per the discretion of the Principal.
- A special prize of Rs.500/-is awarded to the best N.C.C. Cadet, by the college.
- A special prize of Rs. 300/- is awarded to the best N.S.S. volunteer, by the college.
- Youth leadership Award of Rs.1000/- for rendering distinguished social and national service.
- A maximum of 20 lectures will be given to students who participate in extra-curricular activities/sports at state/Panjab university level.
- 50% fee-concession will be offered to the handicapped students in all streams.



## STUDENT COUNCIL

**Elections will be held according to the guidelines of Panjab University, Chandigarh.**

Some students can be nominated on the basis of good conduct, academic performance and participation in co-curricular activities/ sports.

A student standing for any post of the Students' Council must fulfill the following conditions:

1. The student should have fulfilled all the conditions (Academic/Attendance laid down by the University)
2. The student should have scored at least 50% marks in the Semester Examination in the previous year.
3. The students should not have ever been involved in any act of misconduct, misbehaviour or fight etc.
4. Any student involved in any kind of anti institutional activities will be debarred from contesting the elections.
5. She should be obedient, well behaved and disciplined.

***Elections for the following posts will be held:***

President: To be elected from BA-III/ B.Com.-III/ BBA-III/BCA-III/MA (Eco)/ M.Com

Vice President : To be elected from BA-II/BBA-II/ B.Com.-II/BCA-II

Secretary : To be elected from B.Com.-I/BCA-I/BBA-I/MA (Eco)-I/M.Com-I/Diploma

Jt. Secretary : To be elected from any class

Strict action will be taken against the students found guilty of damaging or defacing the college property.





## COLLEGE RULES

### MID SEMESTER TEST (MST)

Mid Semester Test (MST) will be conducted Tentatively in September and in March (Odd and Even Semester respectively), which are compulsory as per P.U. norms. The entire College campus and all classrooms are equipped with CCTV surveillance systems.

1. Permission to be absent from the examination shall not be granted except in very emergent and genuine cases like acute medical emergencies, which may be supported by a documentary evidence and submitted within three days of the Examination.
2. Any student found guilty of using unfair means or engaging in any other misconduct during examination shall be heavily fined or may even be expelled from the college.
3. Students are required to clear all the college dues before appearing for the University examination.

### CONTINUOUS EVALUATION / INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Continuous evaluation/ Internal assessment shall be based on MST, Projects, Class Performance (Class Test/ Unit Test etc.) and Attendance as per Panjab University guidelines.  
Practical Examination: As per Panjab University norms.

### UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RULES AS PER PU

- ◆ The semester examination (Tentatively) will be conducted by the Panjab University in Nov-Dec (1st, 3rd and 5th Semester) and in April-May (2nd, 4th and 6th Semester).  
**A student will be eligible to appear in this examination as a regular student of this college only if she has:**
- ◆ Remained on the rolls of the college for the academic year preceding the examination and has paid the examination fee for each semester as per Panjab University rules.
- ◆ Attended not less than 75 percent of the total number of lectures delivered in all the subjects offered and practical held in the respective subjects.
- ◆ Obtained at least 40 percent marks in the aggregate of all the subjects in Mid Semester Test.

- ◆ Students with practical subjects cannot appear privately. Such students who do not qualify Mid Semester Test would be detained for the year.

- ◆ **The PUPIN/Roll Number issued by the University in the 1st year is valid for the duration of the entire UG/PG course.**

### GENERAL LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

Regular Attendance in class is compulsory and forms a part of the evaluation for Continuous Evaluation / Internal Assessment  
For leave from the college, the following rules should be strictly followed by the students.

- ◆ Leave up to two days is granted by the subject teachers and for more than that by the senior tutor on the recommendation of the subject teachers.
- ◆ Application for leave must be signed by the father/guardian of the student. In case of illness, the application should be accompanied by a medical certificate. No medical leave will be sanctioned after a week.
- ◆ Students absent from college without permission **will be fined Rs.5/- per period and Rs. 5/-** for the whole day.
- ◆ Leave application does not imply granting of lectures for the number of days the student is on leave.
- ◆ If a student remains absent without leave continuously for fifteen days her name will be struck off from the college rolls.
- ◆ The maximum leave allowed to a student during an academic year will be 15 days only. Extra leave shall be automatically cancelled and considered as absence.

### LEAVE RULES FOR SPORTS STUDENTS

- ◆ Free hostel facility will be withdrawn from sports students who do not attend the classes after the tournament is over.
- ◆ The players participating in the university tournaments are required to attend minimum 50% lectures in each subject during their stay in the college.
- ◆ A failed student is not eligible for sports facility during the next academic session.



## DISCIPLINE RULES

- ◆ Raging is strictly prohibited and is punishable by law.
- ◆ Every student must carry her Identity-cum-Library Card to the college every day and produce it whenever required.
- ◆ Attendance at all classes, academic activities, and college functions is compulsory.
- ◆ Students are required to stay updated about college activities and information through college notices, online instructions, and website updates on a regular basis. Ignorance of notices or instructions shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- ◆ It is the responsibility of the student to inform the College Office regarding any change in her address, phone number, email ID, or that of her parents/guardians. The college shall not be responsible for any communication gap arising due to failure to update such information.
- ◆ Parents/guardians are encouraged to remain in contact with faculty members and attend Parent-Teacher Meeting to monitor their ward's academic progress and conduct.
- ◆ The use of mobile phones inside classrooms is strictly prohibited.
- ◆ Wearing helmets is compulsory for students commuting on two-wheelers.
- ◆ Students arriving in four-wheelers accompanied by drivers shall not be permitted to park their vehicles within the college premises.
- ◆ Consumption of non-vegetarian food, alcohol, tobacco, or any other intoxicants is strictly prohibited on the college campus.
- ◆ Students must ensure that lights, fans, and air conditioners in classrooms, laboratories, hostel areas, and other campus facilities are switched off when not in use.
- ◆ Students are advised not to carry large amounts of cash, jewellery, or other valuable items to the college. The college authorities shall not be responsible for any loss or theft of personal belongings.
- ◆ The college authorities shall not be responsible for the conduct or activities of students outside the college premises.
- ◆ Acts such as littering the campus, not using designated bins for dry and wet waste, scribbling on walls, damaging college property, creating disturbances anywhere on the campus or

misusing/damaging smart boards and other digital equipment shall be treated as serious misconduct.

- ◆ Any serious violation of the above rules and regulations may result in disciplinary action, including heavy fines, withdrawal of concessions/scholarships/stipends, suspension, or expulsion from the college in extreme cases.

## MIGRATION RULES

Migration certificate and Certificate of the lower examination passed from all recognized boards/university must be submitted in the college office within 15 days from the date of admission. Migration of students from a college affiliated to any one of the statutory Universities (Indian) to a college affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, is allowed on the following conditions:

1. Lecture statement from the college she migrates from in the middle of the session.
2. Migration of a student from a professional college to an Arts or Science College and vice-versa is not permissible.
3. A migration fee and an eligibility fee shall be charged from every student coming from another university.
4. Migration will not be permitted if the combination of the subjects offered by the students does not tally with the combination of the subjects allowed in this college.
5. When the migration of a student has been allowed, she must join the new college within 15 days, otherwise her migration shall be considered as cancelled.
6. Local Migration of a student shall be allowed only for valid reasons.

### *Compartment/Reappear cases of other Universities*

*A student of any other university who is placed in compartment/reappear in 1st year/2nd year of BA / B.Com / BBA / BCA course is not allowed to join the 2nd/3rd year course of this University.*

## RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the principal and the application must be countersigned by her father or guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until she has cleared all her college dues.
