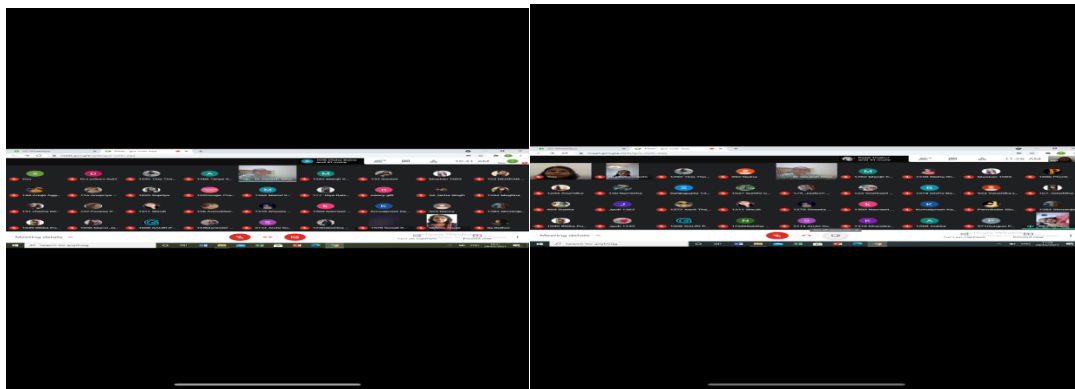
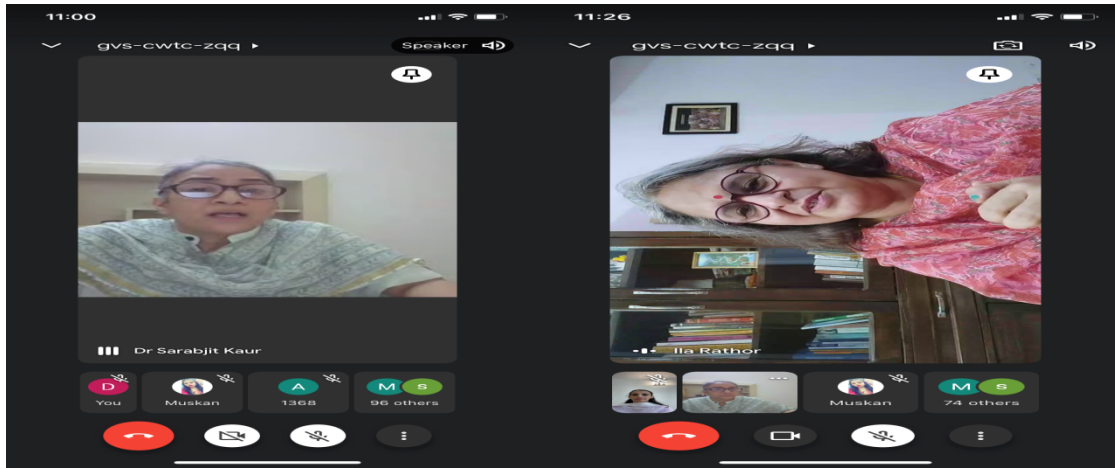

The Department of English organized a Webinar to Celebrate the 75th Anniversary of India’s Freedom on Saturday 29th May, 2021 on the topic “ The Role of Women in India’s Freedom Struggle”. The one hour webinar was conducted through Google Meet and was attended by students and teachers both. The Resource person for the session was Dr. Sarabjit Kaur, an Assistant Professor at the Post Graduate Department of English at Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, Sector 26, Chandigarh.
