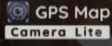

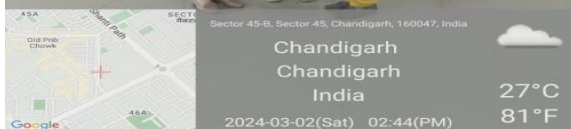

Life Skills Session:

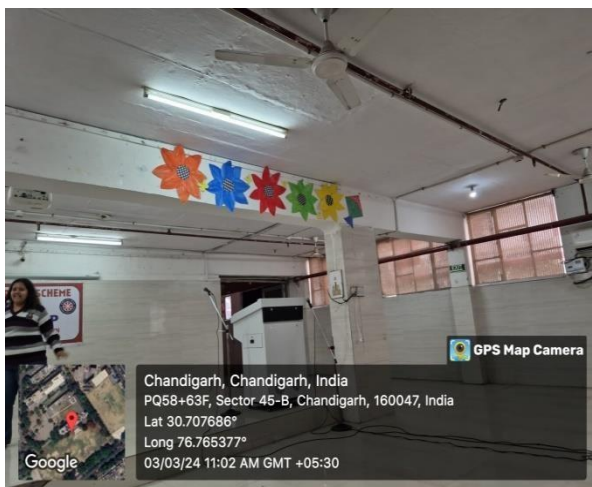

Decoration Activity:

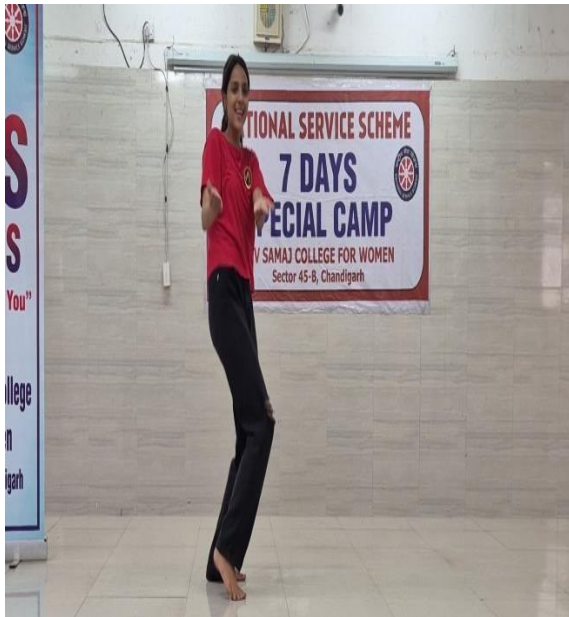
